1. "should" can be used to ask someone to do something or give someone such as:

- I <u>should</u> be at work before 8 a.m.
- You <u>should</u> return the dvd before the rental store closes.
- You should get up early so you can't be late for school.
- 2. "must not" can be used to prohibit someone from doing something, such as :
 - You <u>must not</u> borrow more than three books at a time.
 - Children <u>must not</u> play with matches.
 - The river is full of crocodiles. You <u>must not</u> swim in there.
 - You <u>must not</u> eat that chocolate. It's not yours.

3. There are many others expressions to show probitions, such as:

- Keep away from the fingers. They are wild.
- Don't park your car.
